Use of cookies

Our website and client portal use cookies to distinguish you from other users. This helps us to provide you with a good experience when you browse our website and also allows us to improve our site. By continuing to browse the site, you agree to our use of cookies.

What are cookies

A cookie is a small file of letters and numbers that we store on your browser or your computer's hard drive if you agree. Cookies contain information that is transferred to your computer's hard drive. Cookies are set by us and called first-party cookies. We also use third-party cookies, which are the cookies from a domain different from the domain of the website you are visiting.

Types of cookies

We use the following cookies:

Strictly necessary cookies. These are cookies that are required for the operation of our website. They include, for example, cookies that enable you to log into secure areas of our website, use a shopping cart or make use of e-billing services.

Performance cookies. They allow us to recognise and count the number of visitors and to see how visitors move around our website when they are using it. This helps us to improve the way our website works, for example, by ensuring that users are finding what they are looking for easily.

Functional cookies. These are used to recognise you when you return to our website. This enables us to personalise our content for you, greet you by name and remember your preferences (for example, your choice of language or region).

Targeting cookies. These cookies record your visit to our website, the pages you have visited and the links you have followed. We will use this information to make our website, and the advertising displayed more relevant to your interests. We may also share this information with third parties for this purpose.

Social Media cookies. These cookies are set by a range of social media services that we have added to our website, for example, to enable you to share our content with your friends and networks.

Third-party Cookies

Please note that third parties (including, for example, advertising networks and providers of external services like web traffic analysis services) may also use cookies, over which we have no control. These cookies are likely to be analytical/performance cookies or targeting cookies.

How you manage Cookies

You manage cookies by activating the setting on your browser that allows you to refuse the setting of all or some cookies. However, if you use your browser settings to block all cookies (including essential cookies), you may not be able to access all or parts of our site.
